The work carried out during this virtual mobility consisted of writing the scientific article entitled "Towards output-based surveillance of transmissible cattle diseases: challenges and opportunities". The article is a summary of all the results of the activities of Working Group 4 (WG4) with links to the results of all the other working groups. It presents a synthesis of all SOUND control activities in conjunction with gaps and further steps needed for the implementation of output-based surveillance of transmissible cattle diseases. The article provides a systematic and concise overview and summary of the main objective of this COST action. The work was a continuation of a short-term scientific mission (STSM) in which a detailed summary of the content of all face-to-face and online meetings, workshops, discussion groups and surveys was conducted. Now the content was complemented with the challenges and possible solutions as discussed at the final SOUND control conference where the candidate presented the content of the work she had done during and after the STSM, followed by the final face-to-face discussion in individual working groups.

This work is therefore the basis for a deliverable of WG4 as set out in the Memorandum of Understanding.
